"Kappas Catch The Wave" as my Penny Sansing Mansell, Beta Chapter member of MU State (Mississippi) and her colleague, Melinda Lowe (former Beta Chapter member), received a grant from the Mississippi Professional Educators (MPE) that successfully launched the STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and math) in Action with 3Doodlers project for students at the Mississippi University for Women. Penny is the director of the Director of the Child & Parent



Development Center (CPDC). The goal of the grant was to introduce appropriate technology connecting learning in a STEAM project. The 3Doodlers is a pen that prints in three dimensions and is an Educational Technology (EdTech) tool for activating learning through all the senses. The grant enabled them to purchase 18 3Doodler pens, more than 3,000 multicolor filament strands and multiple 3Doodler resources to support the children as they develop more secure fine motor skills through their collaborative 3Doodler art projects. Mansell said young learners typically don't sit silently or still for very long and want to exhibit curiosity, explore and have a need to engage with their environment. She said simply explaining a lesson without visuals or handson activities won't support an active mind, which is why the 3Doodlers fit with the CPDC's mission to ensure every preschooler learns and grows in a nurturing and fun environment to set the foundation for a lifelong love of education and success in school and life.

#### Honor's Planned for Retiring Coach Gwena Dixon, Harrah, OK

The Harrah Board approved a request to name the swimming pool at the fieldhouse in honor of retiring coach Gwena Dixon. Dixon is retiring after 27 years as a paraprofessional in the school system and 25 years as coach and community leader in the swim program. "She has meant everything to the swim program at Harrah. She does it all, but mostly it is her love and leadership and total dedication to not only the team but the entire community that sets her apart." Her accomplishments include being selected Instructional Employee of the Year five times, starting an adult swim class and after school programs for Middle and Elementary School students.

#### Martin named PTK Distinguished College Administrator



Copiah-Lincoln Community College Wesson Campus Vice President Jackie Laird Martin of Bogue Chitto has been announced as one of only 28 college administrators nationwide to receive the Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Distinguished College Administrator Award. Martin will be honored during PTK Catalyst 2022 in April, the society's annual convention. The award recognizes college administrators working directly with student leaders to solve problems on campus and in their communities. These administrators have taken an active interest in supporting high-achieving students and developing student leaders.

'These college administrators are beloved on campus- they know students by name and by circumstance," said Phi Theta Kappa President and CEO Dr. Lynn Tincher-Ladner. "Their nomination is evidence of the gratitude their PTK students feel for supporting them and students like them- even during the most difficult times."

Honorees were selected from among thousands of college administrators eligible to receive the award. Of the 28 award recipients from across the country, Martin is one of only five from Mississippi.

#### **Kappas Making a Difference**

Judith Goodin of Epsilon Beta, OK/Alpha State, is known for her making a difference in other's lives. Judy has retired after teaching 37 years in the OKC Public Schools. Judy knows how to coupon, and she uses her knowledge to get extra items to give to those who are without. She belongs to a Facebook group, "Down on Your Luck" where she finds people in need and coordinates donations, or provides the items that people are needing. She has made her garage the place where she organizes and dispenses the donations to others.

Judy and her daughters help the homeless through donations to "SISU—a Homeless Teen Shelter" and "the Church under the Bridge". She crochets hats and scarves to help keep the homeless warm. Pill bottles were filled with shampoo and donated along with other items for the Church Under the Bridge at a meeting. "Socks of Love" and books for "Little Read Wagon" were collected and delivered to those charities as well. Donations have also been made to Passageways, a shelter for abused women and children. Donations of love have been given to "Jordon's Crossing," "Kaleo Foundation," "Crisis Nursery" and "Pine Boxes Around OKC". Judy now has a retirement job, that being a job of helping others. 

Anne Baker served Kappa Kappa lota in every office at the local, state and national level with knowledge, grace and poise. As National President in 1986-87 she led the organization with her theme of "Follow

Your Dreams." She led Eta State/Louisiana as State President from 1966-1968 with the theme of "The Key to Kappa Ideals – Love, Faith, Courage, Honor, Loyalty." Anne was a dedicated member of Louisiana's education community and a 62 year member of her beloved Kappa Kappa Iota. She received the coveted Eta State Loretta Doer Achievement Award in 1983. She served 35 years on the board of the Teacher Retirement System of Louisiana, where she was the first woman to hold the office of chair of that board. Anne was known for her knowledge of parliamentary procedure and served numerous times as parliamentarian for state and national presidents. She was often described as "the epitome of grace and class and having the utmost integrity, honesty and transparency."
